Louis Jadot Chardonnay – Hints of fruits and citrus, with mineral notes and vanilla that give it great complexity. \$59

Kim Crawford Sauvignon Blanc 2018 - Classic Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc aromas of citrus, tropical fruit and crushed herbs. \$59

Riesling Chateau St Michelle 2019 – this grape variety has come a long way since the 70s Smooth and tasty medium dry \$59

Benziger Sonoma Chardonnay 2017 – Another cool climate chardonnay this time from California. Lighter and slightly sharper. A delicious drinking wine or wonderful with seafood and chicken. \$59

Pouilly Fume Les Ombelles 2017 – The grapes in this Loire region acquire a greyish bloom due to the cold winter. Hence “fume” or smoked. The wine is however clear and crisp and a classic. \$79

Babich Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc – Made from grapes from several vineyards in New Zealand, this fruity light and dryish sauvignon gets five stars from wine critics. Said to taste of passion fruit. You judge. \$59

Serra Da Estrella – from Northern Spain, the Albarino grape grows in colder atlantic climates and is sharp and flavoursome. \$79

Pio Cesare – Gavi from Piemonte in Italy – fresh and clean with complex flavours \$69

Red

Morgon – Hospice De Bellville- beautifully rounded burgundy with the taste of a classic french red \$69

Chateau St Michel , Columbia Valley – Merlot. This is from the Pacific North West and has the sophisticated structure of wines from those parts \$49

Le Maestrelle – a Tuscan wine with a modern twist. Better than chianti ? \$49

Rioja Cune – Very distinctive taste due to its ageing in oak barrels. Also has a hint of vanilla. Love it or leave it. \$59

Carnivor 2016 - The name says it all. Drink it with meat, preferably red and rarish. From California, its dark and moody, smooth and fruity, like the film stars. \$59 [limited qty]

Mon Frère Pinot Noir - Aromas of cherry, raspberry and plum, with a faint violet hint surrounded by subtle spice from integrated French oak barrel aging. . \$69

Coopers Creek Pinot Noir 2016 - A wine style that furthers New Zealand's reputation as one of the few countries to have successfully come to grips with this fickle, supremely aristocratic grape. \$59

Meiomi – Cabernet Sauvignon - only limited varieties from this California house and we do them all because they are great value \$69

Terrazas Cabernet Sauvignon – a rich cabernet from the increasingly expert wine makers of Argentina \$59

Meiomi Chardonnay – Sonoma county's best, crisp apple flavour with a creamy texture \$89

Duck Pond - The best Pinot Grigio from Oregon we've tasted. \$79

Sanscerre De Chateau Sanscerre - The pinnacle of Loire wines. Similar but more flavourful than the Pouilly Fume produced nearby. Impossible not to like. \$99

Louis Latour Chablis Premier Cru – The crispest of all whites from the very north of Burgundy. Subtle, refined, morish. Un-oaked but with a hint of flintiness. To drink as an aperitif or with fish and poultry. \$139

Cloudy Bay Chardonnay - This is a concentrated chardonnay with fruit in the melon and apple zone. Some flinty complexity here, too. Poached pears and lemons combine on the palate. There's a nutty twist through the finish. \$99

Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2013 – New Zealand wine makers have acquired a fierce reputation for quality and attention to detail. Simply one of the best you can drink. Delicious with our sea food. \$99

Merry Edwards Sauvignon Blanc - A perennially popular and well-made wine, this vintage is no exception, delicious \$149

Corton-Charlemagne - Louis Latour – only 30 acres of grapes are grown to produce this rare and delicious wine with a hint of almond. Yolo. Precious \$595

St Emillion Chateau Ferrand 2013 – A Bordeaux wine of deserved fame. Among the world's greatest wines. Mostly Merlot, soft and fruity but very flavoursome. \$99

Coppola Claret – We are making you an offer you can't refuse. After the Godfathers, director Francis Ford Coppola started making wine. This is his version of a bordeaux. This is worth an Oscar too. \$89

Chianti Ruffino Riserva Ducale – A powerful young Riserva! \$99

La Crema Pinot Noir 2016 - Dark and blackcurrant like this California wine is wonderful with both beef and duck. \$99

Barolo Batasiolo - Regarded by many as Italy's finest red wine, Barolo is produced in the Piedmonte region at the foot of the Alps in Western Italy. Made from the Nebbiolo grape. Traditionally rich in tannin, recent cru's have a softer edge. Sophisticated and delightful. \$99

Patz and Hall Pinot noir Russian river perfection in a pinot noir \$99

ChateauNeuf du Pape – Le Grand Roi, Legendary, powerful, robust and full bodied. \$99

Merry Edwards Pino Noir – said to contain more fruit flavours than any other Pinot noir. California in a a bottle from the Russian River \$169

Stags Leap Cabernet Sauvignon Artemis - “The Cabernet Sauvignon Artemis offers delicious blackcurrant fruit, and attractive meaty, rich blackcurrant fruitiness “ What the wine experts say \$239

Purple Angel – its not purple and its not for angels. Its a blended wine of Camanere and Petit Verdot from Chile. Scores 92 out of 100 amongst the experts. \$229

Chateau Leoville Poyferre St Julien – On the left bank of the Gironde Estuary in northern France only a few terroir produce this rare and sought after wine. Leoville wines are from the north of the region close in character to Pauillac. \$399

Stags Leap Cask 23 – the epitome of this great Californian producers wine. Red , rounded, robust and refined. \$ 595
